E&A CU has planned and implemented a Youth Financial Literacy Program in local high schools after receiving a Michigan Credit Union Foundation Community Reinvestment Initiative grant.

E&A applied for the MCUF CRI grant to educate students in the community about financial literacy because none of the schools in the Port Huron School District offer any type of personal finance education.

Since receiving the grant, E&A Credit Union has given 16 presentations to more than 350 high school seniors in the Port
